### **Urgent Attention:**

In compliance to the orders of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in M.A No. 133 of 2021 in W.P (C) No. 76 of 2015 and NMC Letter No. NMC/MCI/23(1)/2021-Med/003364-66 dated 29.01.2021(Letter enclosed below), the qualifying percentile to be eligible to participate in Super Speciality Counselling for D.M/ M.Ch/ DNB SS courses has been reduced by 05(five) percentile points i.e 45<sup>th</sup> percentile in place of 50<sup>th</sup> percentile.

The last date for admission to Super speciality courses has been extended till **08.02.2021**. Hence, the competent authority has decided to conduct a Mop Up Round of Super Speciality counselling. In view of the above the candidates may note the important points and eligibility conditions for Mop Up Round as under:

1. Only those candidates who have '**NOT**' been **Allotted/ Joined** any seat in Round 1 or Round 2 are eligible to participate.
2. Candidates who are made eligible for the first time due to reduction of percentile can make Fresh Registration and pay the requisite fee to participate in Mop Up Round of Super Speciality counselling.
3. There will not be any Upgradation facility for already joined candidates.
4. All admissions have to close by 08.02.2021. The schedule of Mop Up Round of Super Speciality counselling has been uploaded on MCC website ([www.mcc.nic.in](http://www.mcc.nic.in))

**Subject:** Extension of last date of admission into superspeciality courses for Academic Year 2020-21 and allowing another round of counselling along with reduction in qualifying percentile.

Sir,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, it is informed that the National Medical Commission had approached the Supreme Court of India for permitting extension of last date of admission into superspeciality courses for Academic Year 2020-21. It is informed that our counsel Mr. Gaurav Sharma intimated that the Supreme Court permitted our application extending the last date to 8<sup>th</sup> Feb. 2021. Further, the National Medical Commission considered the matter of reduction of qualifying percentile and after analysis of the data provided by NBE it was found that approximately three times number of candidates would become eligible for filling up vacant seats if qualifying percentile is reduced by 5(five) percentile points i.e. 45<sup>th</sup> percentile in place of 50<sup>th</sup> percentile. Accordingly, the Commission recommends reduction of qualifying percentile by 5 percentile. MCC may be directed to take further action accordingly.
